Though, the Armstrongs, Elliot and Scotts are of the Traitors of Leven, they had associations with the Kerr.

Tried to figure out the Kerr relation;

24. Letters patent of remission by King James the Fourth, under the great seal, to William Douglas of Cavers, William Douglas and Archibald Douglas, for their treasonable intercommuning with the rebels and traitors of Leven and all other treasons, crimes, and offences before the date of the remission, except treason against the King's person, &c. Edinburgh, 10 December 1498.

25. Instrument of Resignation by William Coluile of Oxname, knight, of his lands of the half part of the lands of Fewroule, with tenants, tenandries, and services of free tenants in the barony of Cauensis and shire of Roxburgh, in the hands of William Douglas, lord of the barony of Cauensis, knight, as overlord of the same; quit-claiming all right thereto for an infestment in favour of Andrew Ker of Vuir Craling heritably therein. Done in the Parish Church of Jedworth, 24 December 1499.

26. Notarial Instrument certifying that an honourable man, Andrew Ker of Farnyhyrst, presented William Elwald his follower to the common suit of court of the barony of Cauensis for his lands of the fee of Roul which he holds of the lord baron of Cauensis, who was accepted by an honourable man Sir William Douglas of Cauensis, knight, first taking his oath as use was. Done at Cauensis in plain court held by the said Sir William, 11th February 1501-2. Present, William Roger, Adam Turnbull, Thomas Ker, and Sir James Newbe, vicar of Cauensis, Notary Public.

27. Summons by King James the Fourth under the quarter seal charging his sheriffs in that part to summon lawfully and before witnesses, George Douglas, son and apparent heir of Archibald Earl of Angus, Lord Douglas, to compare before the King and his council at Edinburgh or wherever he chanced to be residing for the time, on the 16th day of February next to come, at the

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men, and maintained a desperate combat, encouraging his men with his whistle till his death induced them to surrender.

1511. Another quarrel betwixt the sister countries rested on the following grounds: — Some English borderers murdered sir Robert Kerr, warden of the middle marches of Scotland. One of the assassins, named Lilburn, with Heron of Ford, the brother of another commonly called the Bastard Heron, was delivered up to the Scottish king by order of Henry VII.; but immediately upon the death of that wise prince the other accomplices of the murder began to show themselves publicly on the border. Andrew Kerr, the son of the slain sir Robert, employed two of his own followers, named Tait, to obtain the revenge which he had in vain sought from the justice of England. They succeeded in their mission, and brought back with them into Scotland the head of Starked, one of the slayers of sir Robert. Kerr caused it to be exposed at the cross of Edinburgh. But the Bastard Heron still lived and was suffered to go at liberty, and on that and other accounts James IV. nourished a deep resentment against his brother-in-law of England.

In 1511 is an Andrew Kerr son of the slain Sir Robert, with two followers the Tait.

The connection of the Elwald is to the Tait is felt to be through the Kerr, of Cessford.

of the said Robert Elwald, and for a similar cause as the preceding, of the lands of "Layhalcht, Carolschelis, hartsgarth et le faulde," lying in the lordship of "ledesdale" and sheriffdom of Roxburgh, to be held for the services of ward and relief.

On 8th January, 1479,¹ Angus granted a precept for infefting the said Robert Elwald in the lands in the last mentioned charter.

On 20th September, 1484,² Angus again executed a precept directed to "Walter Scot de Edschan, Radulpho Ker, fratri Wateri Ker de Cessford et Willielmo Elwaldo de goranbery" to infeft Robert Elwald of the Redheuch in the 20 merk lands of Over and Nether "Larrostane."

On 13th November, 1489,³ at "Calco," the earl directed a further precept to William Ker of "Mersyntoune Radulpho Ker de Primsyde louch, Wilielmo elwad de gouinbery et Wilelmo gledstanys" to infeft Robert Elwad of the "Redehuch" in the lands commonly called "redehuch," "layhauch," "hartsgarth," "caraschele," "dawmane," and "larostanys superior et inferior," lying in the

Above in 1484 when Robert of Elwald received land you will find; Walter Scott of Edschaw, Radulpho (Rudolf) Kerr, and brother Walter Kerr of Cessford, and William Elwald of Gorrenberry, to infeft (make with land) Robert Elwald of Redheugh (red slope), with lands of Lariston (Redheugh, Layheugh, Hartsgarth, Caraschele, Dawmane and Lariston.

This shows a strong connection with pre landholders; Walter Scott of Edschaw, Rudolph, and brother Walter Kerr of Cessford, and William Elwald of Gorrenberry.

ZC3EN Tait, because of association, of Armstrong, Kerr, Scott, is felt to be Y-DNA wise as close as match to anyone

considering they are a descendent of Daniel Elliot of the testimony, but the line likely branches off the family in the early part of the sixteenth century when they still had the name Elwald.
