

Chasing my Y-DNA part 16



The above shows two directions of migration from the East Riding region of Elwald. There is some Elwald spillage along the way. It is felt the blue route through York and on to Kirkandrews is the route which leads my Y-DNA to Redheugh and Liddesdale, the red route is for the Triviotdale region, where it is felt the Elwald were felt to be found in the early fifteenth century. Elwald were found in Hexam region also on the way to northern Northumbria which became Scotland. Thomas seems like a name which after the border was being established seemed to be on the English side of the border.
