

Armstrong households in each county in the Primary Valuation property survey of 1847-64.



In the mid 19th century about a quarter of all Elliott, and a quarter of all Armstrong in Ulster, are in the county of Fermanagh.

It seems that the Elliott and Armstrong came from the border between England and Scotland, and are on the border between Ulster and Ireland. This trend seems to follow in the American frontier.
