The General Court, sitting in Boston since the election, recommended a Public Fast for May 26 to petition Heaven's mercies for persecuted Protestants abroad, for the success of New England's summer crops, and for the setbacks of their enemies everywhere. On a more mundane level the court put Samuel Sewall in charge of finances to keep the Castle armed and ready.<sup>28</sup>

While in Boston, assistants Hathorne and Corwin issued *another* arrest warrant for Philip English. This likely coincided with a search of George Hollard's house near the tide mill at the edge of the North End, but English successfully eluded the officers behind a sack of dirty laundry—the one place they did not look.<sup>29</sup>
