

June 13, 1687 Robert Ellett (Elliot) is of Black Point (Scarborough), but
January 6, 1694/5 is of Portsmouth, NH.

Porpoise, Wells, Maine, where he took the oath of allegiance to Mass., July 5, 1653, and was constable in 1661. He left a will which was probated in March 1669-70. This will mentions father-in-law, John Sanders (to whom he committed his little daughter Elizabeth²), wife Sarah, and sons John² and Peter² Tarbot.

He married about 1648 Sarah,² daughter of John¹ and Ann Saunders of Hampton and Wells; she married, second, Daniel¹ Goodwin of Berwick.

Children:

i. Hannah,² evidently left no issue; perhaps m. about 1669 as first wife, Roger² Plaisted; he m. second, Hannah Furber and was killed in 1675, leaving two children by her.

ii. John,² b. in 1651; on his father's death he was bound to Francis Champernowne; in July, 1672, he became administrator of his father's estate; according to York Deeds, Book XII, p. 141, "he was eldest son of Peter¹ Turbot and the only one who left issue"; York Deeds and Probate Records of Middlesex Co. show that he married about 1672 Mary,² daughter of Richard¹ and Margery (Batson) Young of Cape Porpoise; John² Turbot died about 1680 and his widow Mary married before 1687 Emanuel Davis of Wells; they moved to Newton, Mass., about 1690 with her children. John² and Mary Turbot had a son John,³ who died *s.p.* in

Robert Ellet (Elliot) formerly of Scarborough and Nonsuch River, September, 1695.

Robert Elliot has spelled his last name Elliot, Eliot, and Ellet.

In Ulster as a Scotsman it is Elliot, where Ellet is closest. It is felt there are proportionally more Scots it is felt in the Scarborough region.

Elliot is felt to come from Elliot with an inserted "i". An Eliot, is felt to come from Boston/Cambridge. Son Robert Jr said to die 1715, graduated from Harvard 1701 and went by Robert Eliot.

* FERNALD.—Captain Dennis Fernald, son of Capt. Tobias and Mary (Mendum) Fernald, married Oct. 9, 1750, Sarah, daughter of Captain Charles⁴ and Sarah (Pepperrell) Frost. He died Aug. 2, 1785, she died Aug. 24, 1804, leaving:

Sarah Pepperrell wife of Charles Frost⁴, was a daughter of Captain Andrew and Jane (Eliot) Pepperrell, and was born Dec. 14, 1708; married Sept. 12, 1723. The sister of Sarah was Margery, born March 25, 1712, who married Capt. William son of Lieut.-Gov. John Wentworth, the royalist. They were the only children of Capt. Andrew Pepperrell, the brother of Sir William. Jane Eliot (wife of Captain Andrew Pepperrell) was a daughter of Robert Eliot of New Castle, who was an eminent merchant and member of the Provincial Council of New Hampshire for many years prior to 1700 and was sister of Robert Eliot of Kittery, graduate of Harvard college, 1701. It is from this Robert Eliot that the town of Eliot takes its name, as do many of his descendants in the Leighton, Frost and connected families.

ELIOT.

Hon. Robert Eliot was born in 1643 and is first mentioned 13 Jan. 1660. In 1662 he was appointed Constable for Strawberry Bank. He lived in Portsmouth, now Newcastle, N. H., Scarborough, **Me.**, and on Gerrish's Island in his last days. Was selectman in Portsmouth in 1679 and 1680, and in Scarborough in 1682 and town's Deputy to General Court in 1685. In 1692 he was appointed one of the Councillors of New Hampshire and held that office with the exception of one year till 1715. Timothy Gerrish recorded in his family **Bible**: "My father-in-law, Robert Eliot, Dyed in 82 year of his age in March 24th 1724."

A court record, dated 29 May 1683, speaks of "Robert Eliot, who married the relict and administratrix of Ric. Young of Cape Porpus." He and wife Margery deeded land, 13 June 1687, to son-in-law, Emanuel Davis, and Mary his wife. This Mary was probably daughter of Richard and Margery (Batson) Young. In a Bill of Sale, dated 7 June 1692, Robert Eliot names "my wife whose maiden name was Margery Batson." She was daughter of Stephen Batson of Cape Porpoise, whose will names daughter Margery Young.

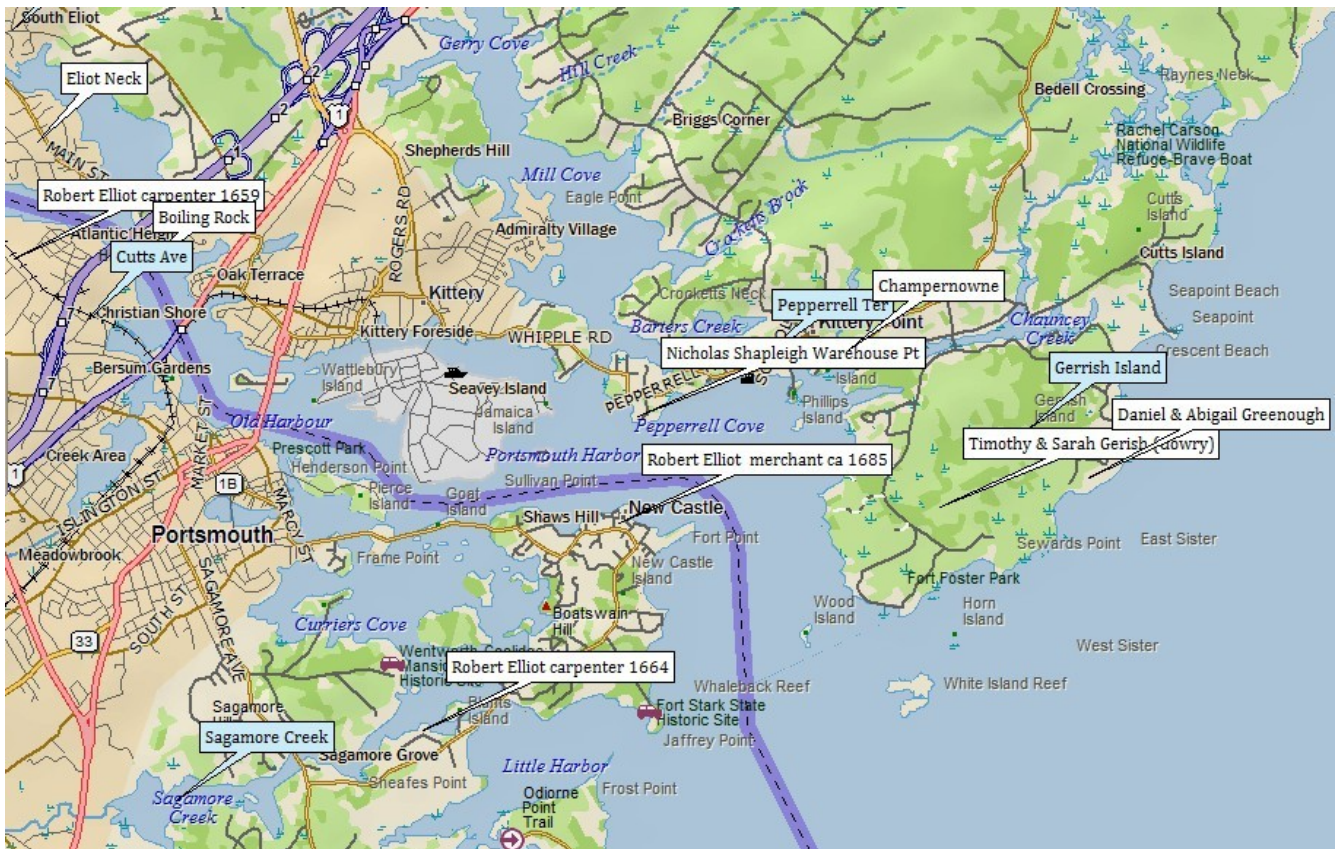
